

The course complies with the requirements of the Merchant Shipping (Safe Manning, Training and Certification) Regulations 2013 and the requirements of the International Convention on Standards of training, certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers, 1978, as amended in 2010, and STCW Code Regulation A-VI/1-4. This course is an ancillary course required as prerequisite to various maritime deck officer positions.

The Personal Safety & Responsibilities course encompasses the following SAQA Unit Standards:

- 114001: Carry out safety, survival and emergency procedures.
- 114002: Contribute to effective human relationships on board a vessel.

Learners completing this STCW accredited course will be able to:

- Explain effective human relationships onboard a vessel.
- Observe standards of work and behavior onboard a vessel.
- Resolve conflicts.
- Demonstrate understanding of survival and emergency notices, procedures and sea survival equipment.
- Assist in abandon ship procedures.
- Assist in retrieving a person overboard.
- Provide support in emergency and survival situations and operate emergency equipment.
